Astrovision, a company formed last fall to buy and merchandise the Bally Professional Arcade video game and computer system. has re-packaged the line and plans 10 new cartridges by July.

"We also have included the Bally Basic program cartridge, which formerly was a \$100 add-on, with the game while maintaining the price of \$299," says President Dan Dawson, who adds that show orders will keep the firm busy through next year.

Features of the unit include four-player

capability, built-in games, calculator, and keypad, multi-TV channel select, removable hand controls, remote game selection, multiprocessors, full keyboard expansion, cartridge storage bin, basic programming cartridge, cassette program storage, and light pen connector.

"The Arcade contains three computer processors operating in parallel for faster motion, better sound, and highest realism on the screen while other video games use only one. With 256 colors and three voice synthesizers, it's comparable to much more expensive computers," Dawson says.

Current cartridges include Galactic Invasion. Grand Prix-Demolition Derby. Music Maker I, Space Fortress, and Biorhythm. New games are to based upon adaptations of Bally commercial arcade games.
